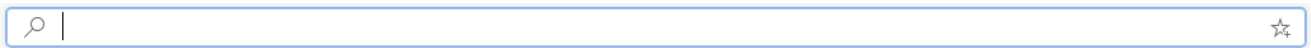

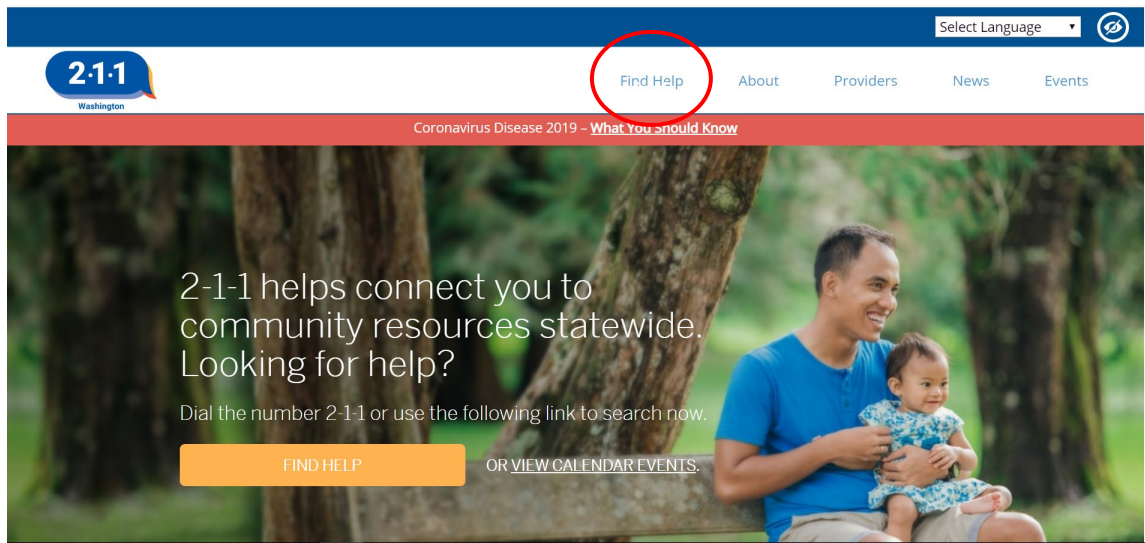
1. Open a browser, such as Google Chrome, Firefox, or Edge.



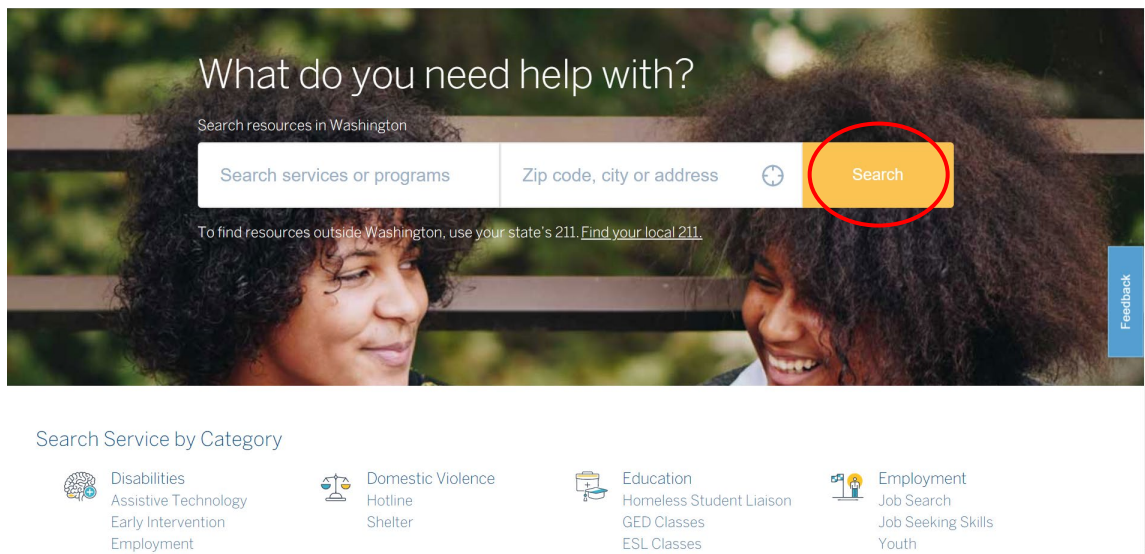
2. In the search bar at the top, type www.wa211.org.


